"Fear not Abram. I am your Shield. Your reward shall be very great."

Who is speaking to Abram?

Abram knows. It's the voice of the Lord. But he doesn't understand what the Lord means. He says, "But Lord, what are you giving me? I still don't have a child. Will everything that's mine, be for my servant?"

Page 3

"No," says the Lord, You will really get a son. Just come outside! Look at the sky. Do you see the stars? Can you count them for me?"

Oh, have you ever tried to count the stars? It's impossible, right? There are sooo many! Then the Lord says to Abram, "I will give you as many children as you can see stars here in the sky. One generation after another generation. They all will be your people."
